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FROM THE DEAN

Dear Chapter Colleagues:

It is a great honor for me to be writing this, my first Dean's letter. I would first like to thank Matthew Burt, our immediate past Dean for his direction and leadership these past two years. He had previously



served as a Member at large on the Executive Committee—but he isn't going away just yet more on that later. I would also like to thank Douglas Franks for his service as Secretary and Keith Wannamaker and Jay Martin for their service as Members at large.

Sarah Wannamaker will move from Member at large to Subdean, Tim Getz will move from Member at large to Secretary and will continue as Newsletter Editor. Jill Mueller will continue as Treasurer. Donald Mulliken will continue as a Member at large. Jay Martin will continue as Webmaster. We welcome Jin Kyung Lim and Dan Gonzalez as new Members at large.

It might be worthwhile here to review the structure of the Executive Committee (often referred to as "The Board"). The Executive Committee is comprised of three classifications of members: Officers (elected for one year terms), as many as nine Members at Large (elected for staggered three year terms), and positions appointed by the Dean (for one year terms): Registrar, Newsletter Editor, and Webmaster. These positions are often held concurrently by Officers and/or Members at large, but need not be.

Some of you have noticed that we haven't mentioned the renewal of membership for the coming year, which begins July 1st. This is because our chapter is participating in the pilot of the new online membership renewal program developed by AGO headquarters. Jill Mueller, Matthew Burt, and I have been working with HQ on customizing the program to accommodate some Palo Alto/Peninsula special requirements.

To facilitate and implement these new procedures, I have asked Jill and Matthew to be Co-Registrars this coming year. When we get the specifics worked out, we will send an email update with instructions.

Early in June, I had the great privilege of hearing an organ recital by Richard Pinel, Acting Music Director of St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, at the Chapel. Of course, Richard played as brilliantly there as he did in his recent visit to the Peninsula. You will recall that he did an organ recital at Christ Church, Portola Valley (a non-Chapter event).

I also had the opportunity to meet the organ scholar from St. Alban's Cathedral, Justin Miller. Justin is an American (Michigan/Ohio) who attended a San Francisco POE when he was eighteen. He had only appreciative and enthusiastic things to say about his POE experience.

Our program year begins earlier than usual this year because of our sponsorship of a Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) in late July. Please see details elsewhere in this newsletter. This POE is made possible by the able leadership of Rani Fischer and so many of our members who have helped organize and prepare for this event.
