Chapter Visits Beethoven Center in October

In October, guild members met for a presentation at the Ira Brilliant Beethoven Center, housed at the San José State University Library. The Center has the largest collection of Beethoven memorabilia outside of Europe. Eric Gjovaag led a discussion of the center's collection and demonstrated the features of the five keyboard instruments (3 reproduction & 2 period). We observed 18th and 19th century innovations like the Turkish pedal, the bassoon pedal, a split damper pedal, and various mechanisms to change tone color; this gave us a new appreciation for the sounds that Beethoven imagined when composing.

Chapter member Dan Gonzalez prepared a handout and discussion of Beethoven's relationship with the organ. He led a discussion of organ building in southern Germany and distributed a fugue and list of works by Beethoven. After the program, we were able to view the displays, play some of the instruments, and take souvenir photos with Beethoven's lock of hair.
