

In addition to being a concert organist, Christoph Bull is a composer, singer-songwriter, pianist and accompanist of silent movies. He is organ professor and University Organist at the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) and Organist-in-Residence at the First Congregational Church of Los Angeles. On Monday evening, February 17, Christophe Mantoux conducted a masterclass at the Congregational Church of San Mateo. Angela Kraft Cross was our gracious host. Christophe is Professor of Organ at the Conservatoire Régional de Paris and the Pôle supérieur de Paris. He also holds the post of Titular Organist at the famous Church of Saint-Séverin in Paris where he has served since 1995. Christophe's manner was charming and his insights were meaningful and masterful. We all learned something from the experience.

Ethan Haman played the Intermezzo from Symphonie IV of Charles-Marie Widor and Nahri Ahn played the Jean Langlais Fete. The church's Casavant organ, with its newly re-engineered console, was particularly suited for the repertoire.

Georgetown University organ featured at Schoenstein Open House

The new three manual 19 rank organ to be installed at Georgetown University in January was demonstrated for over 100 people at an open house/Christmas party in Schoenstein's Benicia plant. The organ, featuring Schoenstein's double expression system, was fully playable and assembled in the erecting room exactly as it will be in Dahlgren Chapel at the University. Twelve members of the founding Schoenstein family attended and the highlight of the day was a presentation of a pair of fine oil paintings of the firm's founder, Felix F. Schoenstein, and his wife. The portraits, in matched frames, were painted in 1915 and will become the centerpieces of the



new Schoenstein & Co. archive. They were a gift of fourth generation organ builder Bertram Schoenstein. The archive, which has been added to the factory building, is devoted to the history of the Schoenstein firm from its beginnings in Germany in the mid 19th century.

Bertram Schoenstein surrounded by eleven members of the Schoenstein family presents paintings of the firm's founder and his wife to Jack Bethards, president of the company.

Oregon Bach Festival Organ Institute

The <u>Oregon Bach Festival</u> is proud to announce the creation of a new organ institute featuring Grammy-award winning artist <u>Paul Jacobs</u> in Eugene, OR from June 30 to July 5, 2014. While organ performance has been a critical element of the festival for 45 seasons, this is the first time it will be included as part of our education programming and featured as prominently. Paul Jacobs will lead participating organists in daily master classes and explorations of organ performance and technique, including a class with OBF Artistic Director <u>Matthew Halls</u>.

Participants and auditors alike will tour major instruments in the region, including the <u>Rosales Op. 11 in Trinity Episcopal Cathedral</u> in Portland and the <u>Brombaugh Organ in Central Lutheran Church</u> in Eugene. Class members will also be able to attend the major concerts of the festival, including the premier of a new completion of Bach's St. Mark Passion.

Geared towards professional organists and students alike, participants for the institute will be selected from auditions but anyone may audit. More information is available at oregonbachfestival.com/organinstitute. We hope you will join us in beautiful Oregon for the first year of this exciting new program!
