National Organ-Playing Competition sponsored by the Ruth and Clarence Mader Memorial Scholarship Fund. She served as Organ Scholar and Assistant Organist at First Congregational Church of Los Angeles, which is the home of the largest church pipe organ in the world, and most recently has been appointed as Organist of the Westwood United Methodist Church where she presides over one of the largest instruments in the region. She is currently pursuing the Graduate Certificate in Organ Performance at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music, studying with Dr. Ladd Thomas.
